Who We Are

Since our founding in October of 1987, the Center for the Women of New York has shown that women working together can be an effective force. We are a voluntary, non-profit organization existing primarily on dues from our members and on the volunteer efforts of business, professional and community women. We aim to be a one-stop, walk-in resource center for women.

Currently, we operate out of office and classroom space donated by Queens Borough President Helen Marshall at Queens Borough Hall in Kew Gardens, Queens during our renovation of a landmarked building at Fort Totten in Bayside, Queens.

The Center for the Women of New York, formerly the Queens Women's Center, is designed to be a research and conference center and "living" museum, dedicated to recording and aiding women's struggles to achieve full equality in our society. Through a Women's Studies Committee, we will record the history of the women's movement in the areas of economy, legal resources, culture, education, religion, art forms (arts, crafts, music, dance, theatre), sports, labor, business and all policies and practices that affect the lives of women and their families.

The first action of the CWNY was to spotlight domestic violence and spearhead the effort in the courts to overcome legal obstacles to providing adequate protection for women who live in crisis situations. Our efforts in this area continue. We are part of the Queens Borough President's Task Force on Sexual Harassment and Domestic Violence, as well as other groups working in this vital area to provide services to victims and for educational programs aimed at prevention of these crimes.

Our regular monthly meetings have included programs on pay equity, women and money, sex trafficking and domestic violence, education, women and health, and legislative issues.

Along with our traditional services, we offer a weekly Job Readiness Workshop, career counseling, help line, Legal Assistance Clinic, Money Management Clinic and Support Groups for crisis situations and life issues. To help meet needs for job training, we have offered instruction in computers and basic career exploration courses. Our new location will enable us also to resume programs that had to be suspended during the renovation, such as classes in self defense, yoga, and a Walking Club.

Our annual "World of Working Women" conference and Job Fair is co-sponsored with us by the Women's Bureau of the U.S. Dept. of Labor, area colleges, businesses, governmental agencies and others. Also, we continue to run educational programs on women's health.

We work in coalition with other women's organizations that advocate for issues important to women. We have a strong link with the colleges and universities in the area. They provide us with interns who are afforded the opportunity of working directly with clients.

She remains in our memory and in our hearts.

We lost a wonderful champion for women on Saturday, March 26th with the passing of Geraldine Ferraro. She was very brave, courageous and fought for women's rights and reproductive freedom despite being in a conservative political district. As a Congresswoman she worked throughout the years on issues of sex discrimination. As an Assistant District Attorney, she made many changes and strengthened services for women who were victims of rape and domestic violence, and worked to establish a strong Crime Victims Bureau. While in Congress she highlighted the special plight of women's inequality by issuing a report, *The Feminization of Poverty*.

This was written by Geraldine about her mother and we believe that the same words would have been appropriate about her:

She was very special. She taught me how to live—and those lessons were invaluable especially through some of the tough times.... But incredibly, in the last several weeks of her life, she also taught me how to die—with dignity and at peace with God. She left behind no debts, no anger, no unspoken words. She left an example that quality of life does not depend on material wealth but spiritual. She left a host of friends who will remember her.

HONOREES: Women in Leadership

Hon. Christine C. Quinn



A native of Glen Cove, New York, Christine Quinn attended Trinity College in Hartford, Connecticut. Quinn entered politics to manage the City Council campaign of Thomas Duane in 1991, after which she was Duane's Chief of Staff for five years. She later became the Executive Director of the New York City Anti-Violence Project. Since her election as City Council Speaker, Christine C. Quinn has established herself as a champion for working families, fighting for policies and services that are critical to the lives of real New Yorkers.

In the past four years, Speaker Quinn has taken on a wide range of issues: She has long advocated investment in Early Childhood Education and the Middle Grades. She has worked extensively on issues of justice and equality, including the fight for marriage equality in New York State. Quinn has worked with the Council on the Environment of New York City to allow New Yorkers to use food stamps to buy fresh produce at Greenmarkets around the city.

Speaker Quinn and the Council recently passed the Clinic Access Bill, which provides women with protections against harassment and intimidation at reproductive health clinics across the City.

Since 1999, Quinn has served as the representative for the 3rd Council District of Manhattan.

Hon. Ann-Margaret Carrozza



Ann-Margaret Carrozza, a former New York State Assemblywoman, represented District 26, which comprises East Flushing, Douglaston, Whitestone, Little Neck, Floral Park, Bay Terrace, and Bayside among other neighborhoods located in Northeast Queens.

Carrozza completed undergraduate studies at SUNY Albany and Empire State College. She received her Juris Doctor degree from the Hofstra University School of Law. Prior to her election to the State Assembly, Carrozza served as a court attorney for Civil Court Judge Peter O'Donoghue and as a clinical intern in the Queens County District Attorney's Office.

First elected in 1996, Carrozza was Chair of the Standing Committee on State and Federal Relations, as well as a member of several other standing committees, including Aging, Banks, Governmental Employees and Insurance.

She currently heads an elder law practice, with offices in Bayside, Queens and Port Jefferson, Long Island.

Constance Del Vecchio-Maltese



Winner of an art scholarship from Parson's School of Design, Constance Del Vecchio-Maltese also attended the School of Art and Design and the Art Student's League of New York. Currently a member of the prestigious Society of Illustrators, she is an emeritus Board Member of the Queens Theatre in the Park and the Queens Council on the Arts. She also served on Mayor Giuliani's Cultural Commission for the Arts and on the Leadership Team of the Portrait Society of New York.

After a long and successful career as an illustrator of children's books and a commercial art editor, Ms. Maltese responded to a new impulse and inspiration. She is best known for her stunning Age of Discovery Navigators, a series of thirteen paintings commemorating the history of discovery in the New World, and a series of paintings featuring women outstanding in their areas of expertise from various cultural backgrounds. Included in this group is an oil on canvas of Astronaut Dr. Ellen Shulman Baker—depicted with Aviatrix Amelia Earhart—which was unveiled at Queensborough Hall in celebration of Women's History Month.

Her work includes portraits of former Presidents Ronald Reagan and George Bush. Among the many awards she has received are Governor Pataki's Award for Excellence and the Governor's Special Citation.

Hon. Carol Gresser



Carol A. Gresser has been involved in the field of education for more than 40 years. She began her work in education as an elementary school teacher and, as her children grew up, continued her work in the New York City public schools as a teacher, school volunteer and PTA president.

Ms. Gresser is a former member of the New York City Board of Education. During her tenure on the Board, Ms. Gresser was elected four times to serve as its president. The New York City school system is the largest in the nation with over one million students and a multi-billion dollar budget.

Ms. Gresser is a member of the Board of Governors of St. John's University and the Leadership Committee of the St. John's University School of Education. She also serves on the Board of Governors of the Flushing Meadows Corona Park in

Queens. She served as Commissioner of the Northeast Queens Nature and Historic Preserve Commission from 1987 until 2005. She is a former member of the Advisory Board of Common Cause/NY and the Board of Trustees of Citizen's Union as well as the Fashion Institute of Technology.

Ms. Gresser is the former Director of the Institute for School Board Leadership at Teachers College/Columbia University and is currently an adjunct professor at St John's University where she also serves as the director of the Carol Gresser Forums.

Ms. Gresser received an Honorary Doctorate of Pedagogy from St. John's University in 2008. In September 2010, Ms. Gresser was elected the Democratic District Leader in the 26th Assembly District, New York.

Hon. Karen Koslowitz



Council Member Karen Koslowitz has been a lifelong and tireless advocate in helping seniors, women and families improve their standard of living and quality of life. Koslowitz serves the 29th District of Queens, which includes Forest Hills, Rego Park, Kew Gardens and parts of Maspeth, Richmond Hill, and Elmhurst. Koslowitz chairs the Committee on Economic Development, and is a member of key council committees including: Consumer Affairs, Education, Finance, Rules, Privileges & Elections and Standards & Ethics.

Prior to her election in 2009, Koslowitz served as Deputy Borough President under Queens Borough President Helen Marshall. She oversaw constituent services and presided over the borough's 14 Community Boards.

Koslowitz began her career in the private sector at Fischbach and Moore, Inc., electrical contractors. She entered the world of public service in 1982 as a Legislative Aide for Congressman Gary Ackerman and subsequently for Council Member Arthur Katzman.

During her tenure, Koslowitz fought side-by-side with her constituents to shut down an all-nude strip club, Runway 69, in a family-friendly residential area—a move many have said played a major role in revitalizing Forest Hills—and introduced legislation to ensure similar clubs may not open in similar neighborhoods.

Karen was raised in the Bronx and is a graduate of the city's public education system.

Fior Rodriguez-Langumas



Fior came to the United States at a young age and grew up in Corona where her roots run deep. Fior's mother was very active in the community and Fior learned the importance of this at a young age.

Fior has worked for Congressman Gary L. Ackerman (CDS) since 1984. As his Director of Immigrant Services, Fior has assisted many constituents within the community.

Fior is an active member of the Queens County Democratic Club since 1982 and has been a District Leader (39th AD: Corona, Jackson Heights and Elmhurst), state committeewoman, and judicial delegate and delegate to the National Convention.

Fior has received service awards from the Father Billini Association, the Peruvian American National Council, ELMCOR, and Borough Presidents Helen Marshall and Claire Shulman.

She organized distribution of medical relief in the Dominican Republic and Haiti after Hurricane George in 1998, and since 2004 has been distributing medication and clothing to the needy in the Dominican Republic.

Sybil Shainwald, Esq.



Sybil Shainwald is a lawyer and women's rights activist whose legal career has focused almost exclusively on women's health issues. She was co-counsel in the nation's first DES daughter victory, *Bichler v. Eli Lilly*. She has successfully litigated thousands of other cases involving drugs and devices harmful to women and their children.

Throughout her career, Ms. Shainwald has conducted meetings in places as far as Kenya and Costa Rica to acquaint women to the toxicity of various products aimed at women. Her writings, lectures, and appearances before Congressional committees, the FDA, and national and international media have raised the national consciousness on crucial women's health issues. She was chair of the National Women's Health Network and was an integral part of the first Black Women's Health conference, the first Rural Women's Health Conference, and many other grassroots

women's groups.

Ms. Shainwald was the first woman to receive the President's Medal from New York Law School. She also received the Dean's Award for Distinguished Achievement for intellectual pursuit in the cause of public service from the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences at Columbia University. The New York County Lawyers' Association presented Ms. Shainwald with the prestigious Edith I. Spivack Award in honor of Women's History Month and in recognition of her dedication to advancing the status of women worldwide.

Ms. Shainwald received a B.A. from the College of William and Mary (Phi Beta Kappa), an M.A. from Columbia University and J.D. from New York Law School.

Hon. Toby Ann Stavisky



Toby Ann Stavisky, the first woman from Queens County elected to the State Senate and the first woman to Chair the Senate Committee on Higher Education, was born and raised in Manhattan. She is a graduate of Bronx High School of Science and Syracuse University, and she completed graduate school at Hunter and Queens Colleges.

After working in the actuarial department of a major insurance company, Ms. Stavisky taught Social Studies in the New York City high schools.

Senator Stavisky was elected to the Senate in 1999. The 16th Senate District includes the communities of Bay Terrace, Bayside, Beechhurst, Clearview Gardens, Electchester, Elmhurst, Flushing, Forest Hills, Fresh Meadows, Hillcrest, Kew Gardens Hills, Mitchell Linden, Oakland Gardens, Pomonok, Queensboro Hill, Rego Park, Whitestone, and Woodside. She serves on the following NYS Senate committees:

Higher Education, Aging, Education, Finance, Judiciary, and Transportation.

Senator Stavisky was a founder of the North Flushing Senior Center and served on its Board of Directors. Ms. Stavisky was a recipient of the Claire Shulman Award as one of the Top 10 Women in Business and in 2010 she was given the New York Association of Homes and Services for the Aging (NYAHS) Partners in Quality Award in recognition of her commitment to advancing quality services for older adults in the State.

Senator Stavisky was married to Dr. Leonard Price Stavisky who served in the NYS Assembly and NYS Senate from 1966 until his death in June of 1999.

Anita Blank



Anita Blank has a lifetime of experience as a community activist. She began her career as a volunteer in 1939, when, as a high school student on the Lower East Side, she traveled to Albany to protest the threatened closing of evening high schools and kindergarten.

During World War II Anita contributed to the war effort by volunteering as a nurse's aid for the American Red Cross for four years while working as a bookkeeper in a button factory. When she moved to Bayside in 1957 Anita became a member of the Bay Terrace Community Council, where she met an equally inspired activist, Ann Jawin. She was involved in numerous projects to spur the development of the new neighborhood,

including improved sewers, traffic lights, a day camp, and the founding of the Bay Community Volunteer Ambulance Corps. She was a member of the PA of PS 169 from 1959-1973, and served as President. Ms. Blank juggled her volunteer work with her full time job as buyer of ski apparel at the family business, Paragon Sports, of which her husband, Sidney Blank, was the owner and President.

Anita is a charter member of the Center for the Women of New York. She is the official photographer and Chair of the CWNJ Book Club.

Good Guys

Jerry Iannece



Jerry Iannece was born in New York City and attended N.Y.U. and St. John's University School of Law. Upon graduation, he went to work as an Assistant District Attorney under District Attorney Mario Merola in the Bronx and subsequently started his own law firm, Iannece & Calvacca.

Active in community service, in 1987 he was appointed Legal Counsel to the Federation of Italian American Organizations of Queens. Mr. Iannece was appointed by Borough President Claire Shulman to Community Board 11 and was quickly chosen as its Zoning Chairman. He was elected President and Chairman of the Board of the Bayside Hills Civic Association in North East Queens in 1996 and sits on the Board of Directors of numerous altruistic organizations.

In 1997 he was the Democratic Candidate for City Council in North East Queens. Today, in addition to his law practice, he provides free legal counsel and law-related lectures to a host of civic, social, political and educational organizations.

James J. Wrynn



James J. Wrynn is the 40th Superintendent of the New York State Insurance Department, serving since August of 2009. Wrynn previously served as the Executive Director of the New York State Insurance Fund. He has 25 years experience as a trial attorney focusing in the areas of life, accident and health insurance, property and casualty insurance, general liability insurance, insurance coverage disputes, professional malpractice, and product liability.

Wrynn is a member of the Economic Club of New York, the New York and New Jersey State Bar Associations, the New York State Trial Lawyers Association, and he also served as a board member of the New York City Economic Development Corp.

Wrynn is also very involved in the Irish Community and in the peace process in Northern Ireland. This includes meetings, conferences and dealings with the Irish

Ambassador, the Consulate General, the British Under- Secretary for Northern Ireland and numerous other parties both here and abroad.

A life-long resident of Queens, Wrynn earned an accounting degree from St. John's University College of Business Administration and graduated from St. John's University School of Law. Active in his community, Wrynn served on Community Board 13.

In Memoriam

Sidney Blank



Sid Blank was a businessman, athlete and veteran. He grew up in Brooklyn in the 1920's and went to Seward Park High School where he was the captain of the track team and met his future wife, Anita Leisner.

Sid was in the army four years during WWII, with the 974 Signal Service Company. He was stationed in the South Pacific from 1944-46.

After the war, he returned to his family business, Paragon Sporting Goods Corp. As its President, he spurred its growth to become a landmark retail establishment. Paragon responded to the emphasis on encouraging women and sports and ushered in a new era of availability of women's sports clothing and equipment in the 70's.

Sid supported the Center for the Women of New York from its beginning, by donating funds, equipment and attending many important meetings. Sid supported the women in his life to grow to their full potentials: his wife, Anita, and daughters, Eileen and Betsy.

Ed Jawin



Edward H. Jawin was a World War II veteran and a civic leader and served as president of the Doug-Bay Manor Civic Assn. in his Douglaston area. He earned two Bronze Stars for valor in battle during the Normandy campaign.

Born in New Britain, Conn. he graduated from Trinity College in Hartford and received his Master's degree in business from New York University. In his professional life, Ed specialized in marketing and training. He worked for Western Union, Ford, Food Fair Industries and the NYS Dept. of Labor. After his retirement, he spent time working with professional playwrighting groups. He also collected stamps and coins.

He greatly valued the mission of the Center for the Women of New York and was particularly interested in the development of the career training program at CWNY's Fort Totten building.

William Gati

William Gati is a saxophonist, vocalist, writer, registered architect, and painter. His work has been featured in many books and articles, for example *Who's Who in the East*, *Who's Who in the World*, *Newsday*, *Creations in Space*, and *Personality Types*.

William Gati has three CD's independently produced called *Piece of Pie*, *Box O' Chocolates*, and *Intricate*. All three recordings are collections of original jazz compositions written, performed and recorded by Mr. Gati. He explores various musical concepts in a truly jazz style.
